

Deaf & Hard of Hearing Considerations

Deaf or hard of hearing people may use:

- A sign language interpreter
- A cochlear implant
- Hearing aids
- An amplifying device
- Any combination of the above

Interaction Tips

- Get their attention politely and face them while communicating.
 Don't hide your face.
- Be aware of background noise and consider moving to a quiet(er) location for conversations and meetings.
- Speak clearly, naturally, and at a consistent pace



A person with hearing loss may have some usable hearing.



If a person with hearing loss does not understand what you're saying, they may ask for you to repeat it.

If they still don't understand, rephrase the sentence. Often, it is just one or two words they did not understand.

- If using a sign language interpreter, face the person who is Deaf.
- Don't shout or use exaggerated mouth movements.
- When speaking to Deaf or hard-of-hearing people, try to **face the light source** so that you are the clearest & most visible.
- You may communicate with gestures and/or writing. Keep a pen and scratch paper nearby.
- **Be sensitive to older people** who may be hard of hearing & reluctant to say so.
