

Assisting Afghans with Disabilities



The Development and Ability Organization (DAO) was founded in early 2004 with an active board of Directors composed entirely of professional individuals from different fields to help guide and support their efforts. Since then, DAO has provided a variety of services in Physical Rehabilitation (Production of Artificial limbs for the landmine survivors and other persons with disabilities), Child Protection, Vocational Training, Disability Inclusive Leadership and Management Training, Capacity Building, Mass Media, and Income Generation projects as well as food and cash distributions in different parts of the country. DAO has established operations in 19 Afghan provinces since early 2004.

At this time DAO publishes a bi-monthly disability publication called Gadoon in three languages (Pashto, Dari, and English). The publication highlights and speaks out about the emerging issues on disability, human rights, health and physical rehabilitation. DAO has provided training to 12,000 persons with disabilities that are directly involved in service delivery in 19 provinces. DAO produced and telecasted 2,088 radio and TV programs over the past 10 years on disability related issues. DAO has also trained 1,800 people in leadership and management, provided 3,000 people with Vocational
